- What is 92Y? Is it open to all students?
 - It is a music based program held during school hours which includes 4 units (over 20 weeks) and field trips. Teaching artist comes to the classroom and goes on a field trip to support what is being taught. Classes picked are based on the curriculum offered by 92Y.
