Aftercare Committee Presentation

Detailed presentation from committee chair Kiki – after meeting with Mrs Leto a pilot program is being proposed for 80 children (does not include pre-k as requires different licensing). The PTA would use professional management Learning Lab to run the program and would hire (with approval from PTA) an onsite
